Risk Assessment Committee

(Food and Water Safety & Toxicology and Risk Science)

Two task forces work to improve public health through toxicological risk assessment and food safety. **Agrochemicals** aims to establish a discussion forum on the implementation and application of Risk Assessment. In addition to microbiology, **Food Safety** explores other areas associated with food safety such as allergens and chemical contaminants.

Biotechnology Committee

(Sustainable Agriculture & Nutrition Security)

Created in 1999, the Biotechnology Committee disseminates scientific knowledge in the area following guidelines and concepts set forth by ILSI Center for Environmental Risk Assessment (CERA) and ILSI Health and Environmental Sciences Institute (HESI). The Committee's actions focus on the science required for commercial introduction of GMO's, their application in agriculture, and their impacts on health and the environment.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Joint Meeting ILSI Brasil & ILSI Argentina on "Construct Based Evaluation"; publication "New technologies for genetic modification – Importance and impact on regulatory process"; Workshop on Sampling, Testing and Statistics - seeds, plants and grain.

Nutrition Committee

(Nutrition, Health and Well-being)

The Committee joins four task forces: Fortified Foods and Supplements; Healthy Lifestyles; Functional Foods; and Clinical Nutrition. Their common purpose is to contribute to the discussion on health issues, thus collaborating to reach a scientific consensus to serve as the basis for guides, guidelines, and policies in regard to foods, nutrition and intervention programs, in addition to helping in the publication of guidance and public health policy by regulatory bodies.

2014 HIGHLIGHTS: Publication: "Vitamins and the interaction with Human Genome"; International Workshop on Functional Foods – Nutrition and Healthy Aging; Publication ILSI Task Force on Enteral Nutrition: estimated composition and costs of blenderized diets.

Corporate actions

The Board of Directors is composed by the President, 6 scientists from academia and 6 company members representatives. This public-private balance ensures that the funds provided by our industry members are used to conduct and disseminate science that is important and useful to many stakeholders. The objective is to stimulate awareness and to fill the gaps in scientific data that impact public health through open dialogue and cooperation.
